

Two railroads - Southern and Seaboard; 16 trains stop. Bus lines to Jacksonville and Gainesville and local ice delivery. Only 1½ miles west is sandy shores of beautiful Little Santa Fe lake, with excellent bathing, fishing, boating and high class dance hall.
